There are 10 Divisions dedicated to enhancing the experience of our members and supporting local communities.

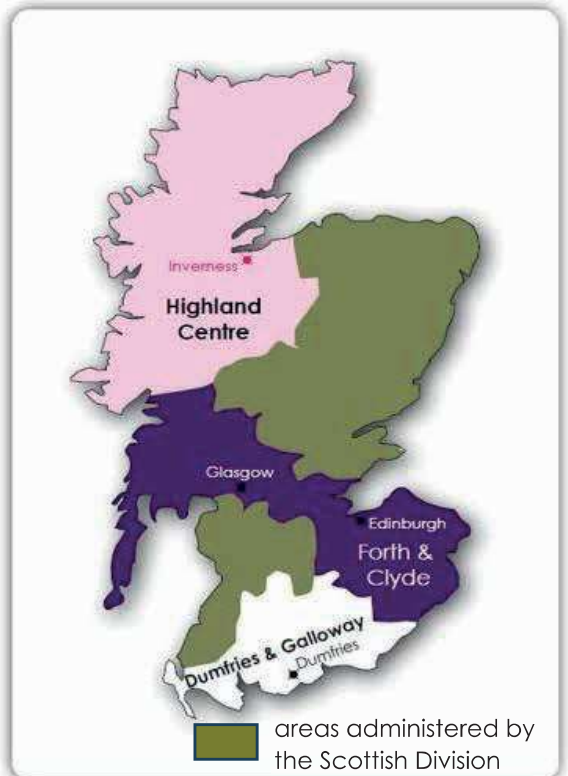

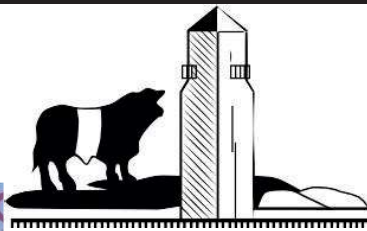

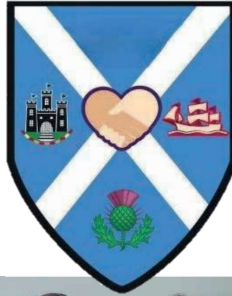

Alba Shield Competition Guidelines

1. The competition is open to all members of Scottish Division and their families.
2. Entries shall be either electronic or photographic prints. Photographic prints can be in black & white or colour and must not exceed A5. A maximum of 2 entries per person will be allowed
3. Photographs must have been taken within the preceding 12 months and should have an obvious connection with caravanning and motorhoming.
4. Entries must be in the hands of the administrator by Saturday 26th September 2026 (This is to allow time for judging before the Scottish AGM).
5. All photographic print entries must have the competitors name and address and CAMC Membership number on the reverse, along with details of the date and place the photograph was taken. The same information must accompany electronic entries.
6. All entries received will be displayed at the Scottish AGM.
7. Judges will be appointed by Scottish Division and their decision is final.
8. The Alba Shield will be engraved with the name of the winner who will retain the shield for one year, returning it to the Scottish Division Administrator prior to the following Scottish AGM.
9. A stamped addressed envelope of a suitable size should be included with any photographic print entries if you require them returned to you.
















A rally is a gathering of Club members who enjoy weekends and longer breaks together. Rallies are held everywhere: national parks, stately homes, fields or caravan sites.

Some rallies are on sites with all facilities, some require you to have your own toilet and shower facilities and some weekends are low tech with no electric hook-up (EHU). You will find everything from relaxing weekends, to themed rallies or rallies joining in at local events such as the Portsoy Boat Festival.

You don't need to be a member of a Centre to attend and all ages are welcome. Above all, rallies are about having fun – there is no pressure to take part in any of the activities. However, you will find a friendly gang and a relaxed atmosphere with fun and games and often food and drink. 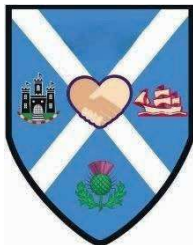

The Royal Burgh of Lanark is steeped in tradition

It has been an important market town in Scotland since medieval times when King David I granted Lanark Royal Burgh status in 1140 and the town is proud of its rich heritage.

Lanark is located at the head of the Clyde Valley, famous for its historic soft fruit production, and sits uphill from New Lanark, one of Scotland's six UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

Lanark has had several important figures in its long history, such as Robert Owen, the important social reformer at New Lanark Mills. The town also has stronger ties to the William Wallace legacy than you might think. He is believed to have married a Lanark lass, Marion Braidfute, and he first drew his sword in Lanark in 1297.

There are a variety of landmarks across the area. Lanark once had its own racecourse near the loch which was a bustling scene in its heyday and home of the Silver Bell, which is one of the oldest sporting trophies in the world and is still held to this day. It was also the venue for Scotland's first ever airshow in 1910 where over 250,000 people came to watch the spectacle.

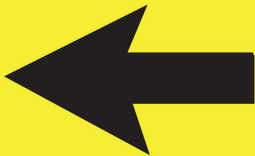

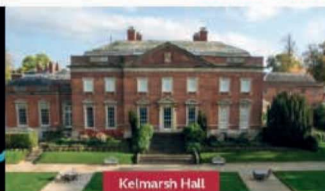

These nominations require to bear the signatures of the proposer and the seconder, together with the signature of the person nominated, signifying that he/she is prepared to accept office.

Members are reminded that only full, joint and family members are entitled to speak and vote. Voting papers will be issued on production of a valid membership card or membership e-Card details.

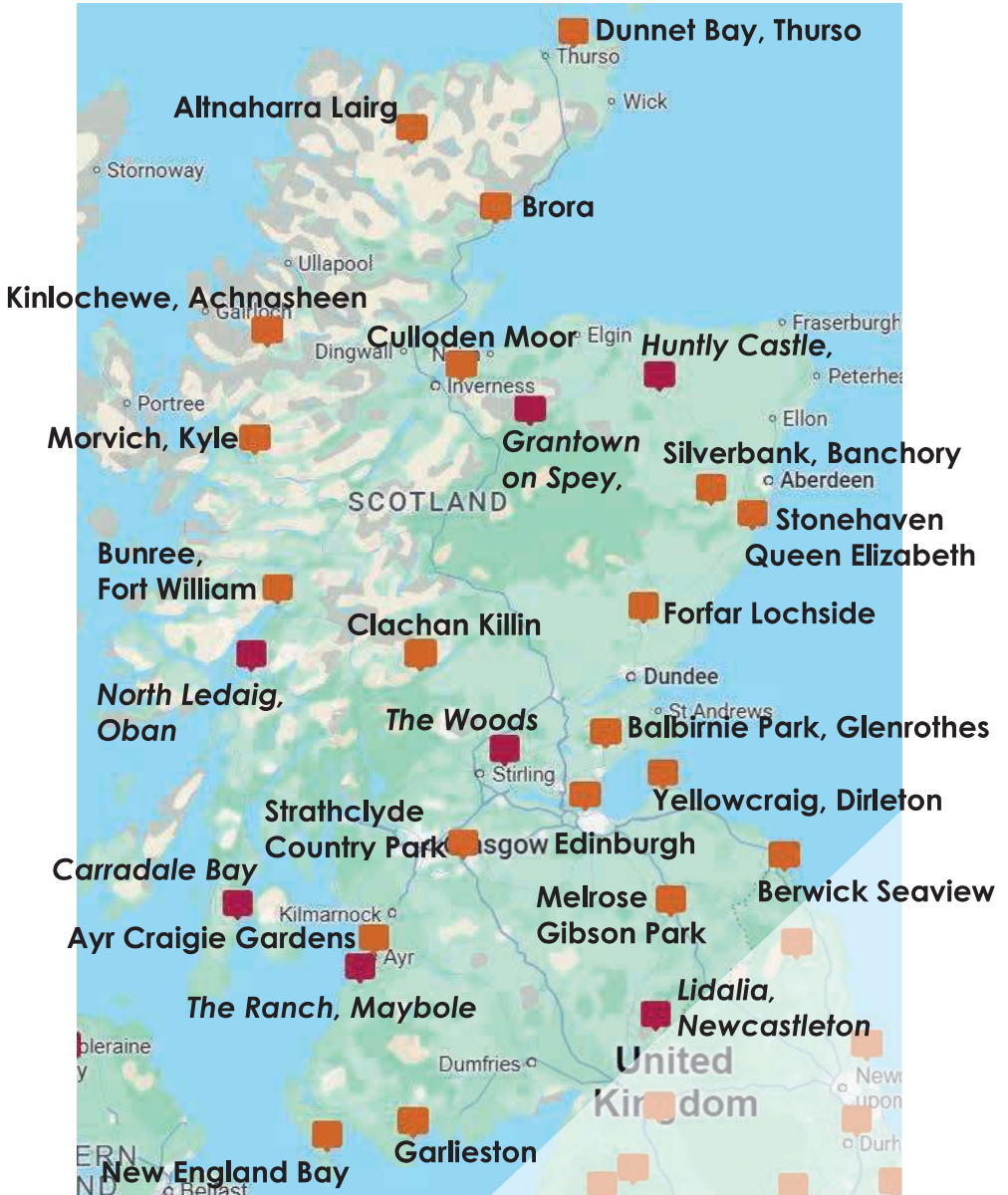

CONSTITUTION OF CARAVAN AND MOTORHOME CLUB SCOTTISH DIVISION

Date: 12th October 2024

Name

1. The Division shall be named the '*Caravan and Motorhome Club – Scottish Division*'. It is hereinafter called 'the Division'.
2. The Division oversees the following area and Centres of the Caravan and Motorhome Club: *Scotland: Highland, Dumfries & Galloway and Forth & Clyde Centres*

Objectives

3. The objectives of the Division shall be:
 - a. To provide a means whereby the Caravan and Motorhome Club interests of all members living in the area may be fostered.
 - b. To represent general matters of Club or Centre interest to the Club Council.
 - c. Coordinate the activities of the constituent Centres and promote them with the wider membership.
 - d. To provide a forum to discuss and solve local issues at a local level and be the first point of contact for constituent Centres.
 - e. The Division will contact the Governance Office should they be unable to resolve any issues at a local level.

Management

4. The affairs and activities of the Division shall be controlled and managed by a Divisional Team comprising:
 - a. Chair, Deputy Chair, Administrator, Treasurer, and Digital Champion. They shall be elected each year at the Annual General Meeting of the Division and shall form the Elected Team. If the Elected Team members are Member Representatives this will not affect the quota in (c).
 - b. One delegate is appointed from the Centre Committee¹ of each Centre within the area.
 - c. Up to six Member Representatives, being current Club members, not registered with any Centre for two years, and approved by the Club's Executive Committee. They may serve a maximum of three consecutive years and then re-apply for selection by the Executive Committee via the Governance Office
5. All elected positions may normally serve a maximum of three consecutive years. After completing a three-year term of office, a member may offer them self up for election again in a different role.
 - a. There is a process to remove someone from a position of office, which involves a vote of no confidence by a quorum of the Divisional Team, which must be approved by the Executive Committee.
6. Any member of the Club living in a Division or registered with a Centre in that area as defined in paragraph 2 shall be eligible to become an elected member in a Division. Members with the appropriate skills are encouraged to apply. (Terms of Reference are available as a separate document)
7. The Executive Committee Chairman and Vice-Chairmen of the Club shall be ex-officio² members of the Divisional Team. Members of the Executive Committee and Nominated members living in the area may be in attendance with the right to speak but not to vote. The Director General, or their representative, may also be in attendance with the right to speak, but not to vote.

8. Should a vacancy occur in the elected members of the Divisional Team during the year, the team may co-opt a member to fill the vacancy. A co-opted member has the same rights as an elected member.
9. At Divisional Team meetings, 30% of those eligible to vote shall form a quorum.
10. The Divisional Team will be required to meet the Objectives in paragraph 3 above.
11. An elected team member of the Division is not able to hold a position on a Centre Committee unless approved by the Executive Committee.

Meetings

12. Annual General Meetings (AGM) shall be held at such time and place as the Divisional Team decides, provided that every AGM shall be held not more than fifteen months after the holding of the last preceding AGM.
 - a. The AGM should be held before the Caravan and Motorhome Clubs' AGM to ensure the newly-elected Chair can attend Club Council meetings afterwards.
13. The Annual General Meeting of each Division shall be open to all members of the Caravan and Motorhome Club. However, only those Club members resident in the designated area of the Division and those members of the Centres that make up the area shall be entitled to speak and vote. It shall be at a time and place fixed at the preceding Divisional Annual General Meeting or by the Divisional Team.
 - a. At the meeting, an annual summary, created by the team, and the Treasurer shall report on the Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet duly audited for the preceding financial year.
 - b. Nominations for elected positions, signed by the nominee, must be received in writing by the Administrator of the Division not later than 28 days before the Annual General Meeting.
14. Notice of the Annual General Meeting, specifying the time, place, main objectives and any special motions of the meeting shall be submitted by the Division's Administrator in time for publication in the Club Magazine and via other channels. Non-receipt of the Club Magazine shall not be grounds for invalidating the meeting.
15. Notices of Special Motion for the Annual General Meeting must be lodged with the Administrator not less than 28 days before the meeting.
16. A Special General Meeting (SGM) of the Division shall be called by the Administrator on receipt of either:
 - a. Instructions from the Divisional Team Or
 - b. A request in writing giving 28 days' notice signed by not fewer than twenty-five Full members of the Division, such request setting out the purpose for which a Special General Meeting (SGM) is desired. Not less than 14 clear days' notice must be given to members. The Notice calling an SGM shall set forth clearly the purpose for which the meeting is being held.
17. At all General Meetings (AGM and SGM), ten members, with voting powers, shall form a quorum.
18. At all General Meetings, the Chair of the Division shall preside; failing that, another elected member. In the absence of both, the meeting shall elect an interim Chair.
19. The Divisional Team will hold at least three inclusive meetings each year either in person or using other methods of communication, in addition to the AGM.
 - a. At least three additional meetings, such as peer-group meetings, should be facilitated using other methods of modern communication.
 - b. Any meeting needs to be agreed in advance with a distributed Agenda. It should be inclusive to all attendees and can cover topics of interest to those present.

Voting Powers

20. At the Divisional Annual General Meeting, each qualified member (see *paragraph 12 above*) shall, on the proof of current Club membership³, have one vote.
21. In votes for office at the AGM when more than one nomination is received, voting shall be by secret ballot.
22. Voting at Divisional Team Meetings on all motions, amendments and questions shall be determined by a show of hands or by using a digital voting option unless a poll be demanded by the Chair of the meeting or by three members present.
23. At both General Meetings and Divisional Team Meetings, the Chair of the meeting shall have a second, and casting vote, for use in the event of a tie.

Finance

24. Each Division will receive an annual grant from Club funds to defray agreed administrative costs. The amount of such a grant will be determined by the Executive Committee. Grants will be subject to periodic review.
25. The financial year of the Division shall end on the 31st day of December.
26. The books and accounts of the Treasurer shall be examined by an Independent Examiner.
27. The Independent Examiner, properly qualified, not a member of the Divisional Team, shall be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting. The Independent Examiner's expenses will be defrayed by the Club.
28. No member may pledge the Credit of the Division unless authorised by the Divisional Team.

Representation on Club Council

29. The Division's Chair shall be the appointed representative on Club Council. If unable to attend a Club Council meeting, the Division's Chair shall appoint one of the other elected team members to attend in their place.

Alteration of Constitution

30. Proposals for amendments to the Constitution shall be made only at a General Meeting of the Division by a vote of two-thirds of the members present and voting at such meeting and shall be submitted to the Executive Committee of the Caravan and Motorhome Club.
 - a. Not less than 'three calendar months' notice of motion to make such additions or amendments shall be given in writing to the Administrator. The motion shall be made known to the members by publishing either the motion or a statement.
 - b. The power to decide amendments to the Constitution is vested solely in the Executive Committee under Club Bye-law 35.2 and any agreed amendments will be complied with and will have to apply to all Divisions.
31. Any Division may seek the agreement of the Executive Committee, via the Governance Team, to raise any exceptional circumstances which might impact its ability to meet the requirements of a particular section of the constitution.

Code of Conduct

32. The Divisional Team will agree to read the Committee Code of Conduct at the first meeting following the AGM, and it will be noted that they agree to follow it as part of the role that they have undertaken.

¹ If unable to attend, a representative can be appointed by the Centre.

² entitled to be a part of the Division because of the position they hold at the Club and have voting rights

³ This can be a physical membership card, digital membership card or using the Club membership text number to check membership validity.

Division Elected Roles

Division Chair: This position is elected at the Division AGM and will be in position for a maximum of three consecutive years, per the Division's Constitution.

Responsibilities:

- 1 Be a point of contact for constituent Centre issues.
- 2 To represent the Division at Club Council meetings, or nominate a delegate if unable to attend.
- 3 To chair Division Team meetings and the Division AGM.
- 4 To have the casting vote on deadlocked issues being discussed by the Division Team.
- 5 To present a report at the Division's AGM (this report will be created with all of the team members' input).
- 6 To be a co-signatory on the Division's bank account.

Deputy Chair: This position is elected at the Division AGM and will be in position for a maximum of three consecutive years, per the Division's Constitution. If the Deputy Chair wishes to be the Chair they will need to put themselves up for election at the relevant AGM.

Responsibilities:

- 1 Be a point of contact for constituent Centre issues.
- 2 To assist the Chair and help with succession planning for the Division.
- 3 To chair Division meetings and the Division AGM in the absence of the Chair.
- 4 To coordinate a rally/events programme for the Division's constituent Centres, including collating rally/events data.

Division Administrator: his position is elected at the Division AGM and will be in position for a maximum of three consecutive years, per the Division's Constitution. There can be an additional person to work with the Administrator and split the role, chosen by the Team and not elected.

Responsibilities:

- 1 Be a point of contact for constituent Centre issues.
- 2 The Division Administrator (s) will oversee the administration of running the Division Team, which can include dealing with correspondence by email.
- 3 Arrange the Division meetings, whether in-person or virtual/online.
- 4 Produce the agenda for the Team's meetings and write the relevant meeting notes (which contain the date, time, location, people present, decisions made and actions to be taken), and produce them in a timely manner.
- 5 To be a co-signatory on the Division's bank account.

Division Treasurer: This position is elected at the Division AGM and will be in position for a maximum of three consecutive years, per the Division's Constitution. There can be an additional person to work with the Treasurer and split the role, chosen by the Team and not elected.

Responsibilities:

- 1 Be a point of contact for constituent Centre issues.
- 2 Maintaining and managing the Division's bank account and monitoring income and expenditure.
- 3 Be able to advise the Division Team on the finances, and set budgets for events, where necessary.
- 4 Create a report for the Division's AGM.
- 5 Share and look at opportunities for best practices with other divisions.

- 6 Maintain an inventory of assets for the Division.
- 7 To be a co-signatory on the Division's bank account.

Division Digital Champion: This position is elected at the Division AGM and will be in position for a maximum of three consecutive years, per the Division's Constitution. There can be an additional two people, with technical knowledge, to work with the Digital Champion, chosen by the Team from the general membership.

Responsibilities:

- 1 Be a point of contact for constituent Centre issues
- 2 Maintain the Division's website with updates and promote/market local events.
- 3 Assist the Division Deputy Chair in coordinating a rally/events programme for constituent Centres.
- 4 Responsible for maintaining the Division's Social media pages, including the 'open' Facebook page and 'closed' Facebook group, should you choose to operate one.
- 5 Promoting the activities and events of constituent Centres and liaising with them to get the information.
- 6 Offer and monitor a promotional hub for photographic images/templates/videos and branding, which includes guidance.

Division Centre Representatives: Each constituent Centre should have one representative present at Division meetings. If the representative is unable to attend, then a delegate can be sent to represent the Centre.

Responsibilities:

- 1 Be the conduit between the Centre Committee and the Division Team.
- 2 Update the Division Team on upcoming Centre events and activities.
- 3 To represent Centre concerns and achievements with the Division Team on behalf of the Centre Committee.

Division Member Representatives: Up to six members, who will be in position for a maximum of three consecutive years, per the Division's Constitution and approved by the Executive Committee. A member representative may put themselves up for an elected position on the Team.

Responsibilities:

- 1 To share wider membership views with the Division Team.
- 2 Provide feedback on CAMC services and products used by the wider membership.
